These qualities, as well as other useful related qualities, formed the words we found in our Celebration Café Word Hunt. Our Peer Support Leaders facilitated us to hunt the letters for our words, that completed the sentence, "We are ... !". We then discussed what the word meant and how we could show it as a 'freeze-frame', to help us further explore qualities that help us be successful learners. Below are some of




the photos of us 'freeze-framing'. This activity helped us reflect and celebrate our learning.

# Thank you

We'd like to extend a huge thank you to the students from Marsden High School and their hospitality teacher, Mrs Train who assisted in the food preparation for the Celebration Café. The students from Years 10 and 11 put their training in Food Technology and Hospitality into practice, making approximately 200 sandwiches and chopping up the watermelon. It is only with their assistance that we were able to continue the great tradition of our Celebration Café.

#### **Success Cards Survey**

Thanks to the 50% of parents, students and teachers who completed our survey to find out the impact of



the implementation of Success Cards this year. In response to the question about the continuation of Success Cards, 80% of parents, 100% of teachers and 79% of students indicated that they should definitely continue next year.

98% of parents preferred written reasons for the receipt of success cards, even though this meant that less were distributed overall. 50% of teachers preferred handing out more cards without reasons.

Additional comments included that often parents do not get to see the reasons for success cards as they are kept at school and a request was made for better quality badges to

reflect the prestige of the award.

On the basis of this survey, and taking note of feedback, the school will continue to use success cards in 2019 as part of the classroom reward system.
