Outdoor Classroom Day 2019

On Thursday 7 November, Melrose Park Public School took part in Outdoor Classroom Day. When teachers take learning outdoors, they report positive impacts on the behaviour and learning of students. We are blessed with many great outdoor learning spaces in our school such as the peace garden, kitchen garden, the playground and oval!

Teachers were asked to bring a lesson outdoors for a portion of the day. It was a very warm and windy day which wasn't ideal, yet teachers and students were still eager to bring their learning outside. Mr Steel brought out 4/5E students into the peace garden to complete their mathematics. KP also ventured out into the peace garden, using fallen leaves, sticks and twigs to create temporary artworks representing fireworks. KA were also spotted out on the playground, tracing around each others shadows. All students were engaged and happy.

Outdoor Classroom Day is more than just one day of learning outside; its a global campaign to drive change, to improve the mental and physical health and wellbeing of our children, and support them in an engaging and positive learning environment.

Scienza Viva comes to Melrose Park Public School

On Thursday 14 November students in K-2 participated in science activities brought to us by the team at Scienza Viva. The best thing about the visit was that the students got to do almost all of the experiments themselves. The experiments used common chemicals such as food dye, vinegar, bicarbonate of soda and cabbage juice – yuk!!!

Among the activities, students were shown how to separate green food dye into blue and yellow using chromatography paper. They used vinegar and baking soda to create carbon dioxide to inflate a rubber glove and make small models that simulated an active volcano.

The students were very excited when Effie, the scientist blew a plastic film canister to the ceiling of the hall using carbon dioxide made by shaking vinegar and bicarbonate of soda together. It made a big bang!

The Scienza Viva visit was really worthwhile. The students thoroughly enjoyed the session.

The band provides students with the opportunity to learn a concert band instrument including the clarinet, saxophone, flute, trumpet, trombone, percussion and bass guitar.


