Canberra Excursion 2023 - Final Information

Departure: Tuesday 23rd May 6:00 am. Arrive by 5:45 am to load.

Return: Thursday 25th May, approximately 5:30 pm. Please understand that timing can be difficult as it is dependent on traffic.

Medication: All medication currently held by the school for children in Years 5 and 6 will be taken on the excursion i.e. asthma puffers, epi-pens, anti-histamines etc. If your child has any additional medication (prescription or non-prescription) that needs to be taken while on the excursion, please fill out the medication form and hand the medication to Miss Mee. If your child is prone to **travel sickness** please ensure they have suitable medication before our trip, and have enough medication for the return journey. Any student bringing an asthma puffer to camp should have already submitted an asthma plan from their doctor to the school.

Covid-19 Declaration: The school is required to complete a declaration stating that they will ensure no participants are experiencing symptoms consistent with Covid-19 when the excursion commences. Any student exhibiting symptoms during the excursion will be given a RAT-test, asked to wear a mask when near others and their contact with others will be minimised.

Tuesday

As the students will be attending Parliament House on this day, all students must wear a clean full school uniform (named as it could be easily mixed up with someone else's later on).

Please ensure your child has a small backpack to be taken on the bus, please include:

- One or two school jackets (current Canberra temperature is 4-15 degrees)
- A raincoat
- A healthy recess, lunch and afternoon snack
- A refillable drink bottle (water)
- A wallet with up to \$50 for small souvenirs
- Book to read
- Optional camera, deck of cards

Please pack a small overnight bag containing:

- Pyjamas
- Toiletries toothbrush, toothpaste, soap
- Two sets of casual clothes including a warm jacket, shoes and hats (One set for Wednesday and one set for Thursday)
- NO sheets, towels, (supplied by hotel).

Note: The overnight bag will not be accessible until the students arrive at their accommodation as it will be stored in the bus storage compartment.

Wednesday

Students are able to wear casual clothes on this day such as a T-shirt, jumper and jeans in a clean and presentable order. (No t/shirts with slogans or inappropriate motifs.)

Thursday

Students are able to wear casual clothes on this day such as a T-shirt, jumper and tracksuit pants in a clean and presentable order. (No t/shirts with slogans or inappropriate motifs.) Note that students will be participating in climbing activities requiring a harness, so longer pants are required.

- The students will be supervised on the excursion by Miss Mee and Mrs Leszczynski.
