Dear Kindergarten parents and carers,

Welcome back to Term 4. Can you believe how quickly this year is going? As Term 4 begins, we are excited to continue providing many hands on, creative learning opportunities for your child. This letter contains an overview of topics which are to be covered this term.



Uniform

Students are expected to be wearing their full summer uniform during Term 4. Any uniform needs can be ordered online from the uniform shop and will be provided to your child at the earliest convenience and availability.

Attendance and Punctuality

Regular attendance at school is essential to assist students to maximise their potential. Parents are required to explain the absences of their children from school promptly and within seven days to the school. An explanation for absence must be provided to the school within 7 days of the first day of any period of absence. In addition to this, the school also highly encourages punctuality to minimise disruption to the morning routine, settling into the day and maximise learning time.

Library/Home Reading Folders/Learning Snapshots

Please continue to hand in Home Reading Folders and the decodable texts each Thursday so that they can be sighted by the teacher. Library bags and books continue to be brought in each Friday. Learning snapshots will continue to be sent home fortnightly from Week 2.

High Expectations and School Expectations

Our school wide program of Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBL) has three expectations that underpin everything we strive for at Melrose Park Public School. Students are Respectful, Responsible Learners. Positive reinforcement is used to promote good behaviour. This may be in the form of verbal praise and privileges, success cards and awards at assembly.

This term Kindergarten students are now expected to know all class and playground expectations and must abide by these at all times. Current class management involves 3 warnings before being sent to the Thinking Table. If additional warnings are given, then students will either miss out on some play time or fun classroom activities. This term we are introducing orange notification cards. These cards are to notify parents/carers of repeated mid level or high level behaviours. If a notification card is sent home, please spend some time with your child discussing the importance of following school expectations and the impact that their action has on others. To ensure clear communication between students, parents and teachers, please sign and return the card to the classroom teacher.

Throughout the term, the InitiaLit program will be continued. There will be a greater focus on digraphs (two letters that make one sound). Reading Students will continue to apply reading strategies to read decodable texts during weekly Reading Groups with the teacher. Writing Students will explore the features of narrative texts. With guidance, they will create their own narratives. In additional writing lessons, a focus will be on sentence structure and punctuation. This unit explores emotions, emotional responses to experiences. Students learn about the interpersonal skills required to communicate and interact in a caring and respectful way with others and the importance of showing kindness. Students practise using these skills with a variety of people in a range of contexts. Wellbeing Each Monday Mrs Gallagher will lead a 30 minute lesson on Emotional Literacy. This will help students understand themselves and others better. Physical Education Each Monday students will participate in dance lessons run by Dance2bfit. This dance will be performed at the end of the term. In PE students will continue to practise fundamental movement skills and participate in games. Sports uniforms are to be worn on Fridays.

Students will get the opportunity to create and perform their own dance versions of a fairy tale, inspired by the examples shown. Drama Drama will be embedded into Literacy and PDH lessons. In literacy, students will use imagination and the elements of drama to re-enact key events in familiar narratives. In PDH, students will create and perform simple role plays to show how to effectively communicate feelings.	Students will develop an understanding of what makes a place special and how this may differ for different people. Students will discuss why certain places are important to Aboriginal people.
